Not bad for someone who struggled at school. Einstein was born in Ulm, Germany in 1879. His parents were concerned that he scarcely talked until the age of three, but he was not so much a backward, as a quiet child. As a schoolboy, his work didn't scream 'genius' and even his teachers found it hard to reconcile to the idea that the student they had known, was the great scientist he later became. After working hard in the laboratory but skipping lectures, Einstein graduated with an unexceptional record in 1900. He couldn't find a job in a university so he worked for the Swiss Patent Office and spent his spare time working on theoretical physics problems. At the age of just 26, whilst still at the patent office, he published three papers that changed the way we all view the world. By the time he finally found an academic job in 1909, Einstein's reputation as one of the greatest scientists of all times was spreading rapidly. And in 1915, at the age of 36, Einstein produced his theory of general relativity which delved even further into the working of the universe. After being awarded the 1921 Nobel Prize for physics for his work on the photoelectric effect, Einstein became closely involved with the development of quantum theory before moving on to pursue the search for a grand unified theory that would tie all of physics together. In 1933, Einstein escaped the persecution of Jews by Nazi Germany by accepting a position at the Institute for Advanced Study at Princeton, USA where he spent the rest of his life. Although he initially supported the use of atomic weapons as a deterrent in the Second World War he later campaigned for nuclear disarmament and world peace. her deafness. At the age of sixteen she became the first deaf student at the Royal Academy in London. She went on to make lots of CDs and is now famous for being the world's only full time solo percussionist. Evelyn likes to play unusual instruments and has over a thousand, some of which she has made herself. She likes to play with musicians from all over the world, and requests composers to create music especially for her. An example of this is a piece which was composed for her by the jazz composer Diango Bates, for which he used kitchen pots and pans as instruments. Her sixteen solo albums (including twelve on the RCA/BMG label) have reached a remarkably diverse public, as have her numerous collaborations with musicians from the non-classical world.

Glennie contends that hearing is a form of touch, and that everyone, whether "deaf" or not, processes sound in an individual way. When Evelyn performs she doesn't wear shoes or socks. This is to enable her to feel the music through the floor and her body. Usually, percussionists play at the back of the Orchestra, Evelyn plays at the front so that she can lip – read signals from the conductor. Glennie has said that she doesn't want an operation to cure her deafness; she likes being who she is and doesn't want to change the way she works. Like many other courageous people, she tries hard to help others. She has helped many deaf children by giving them an opportunity to learn a musical instrument.
